Celebration International Church Story

Back in 1932 Pastor Alfred White started holding meetings on the Wellesley Park Campgrounds. From mid-June through Labor Day people would gather three times daily to encounter and praise God. Naturally, lives were being transformed through the life-giving message of the Gospel and the ministry of the Holy Spirit. A number of these attendees started purchasing land nearby, and for them the meetings continued year-round. On June 16, 1937, Pastor Alfred White and this little band started Wellesley Park Assembly of God. Their goal was simple, help people connect with God and uncover their fullest potential through a life that praises Him.

Over the years, that goal has been advanced by several great pastors. It has advanced out of a campground "cookshack," out of a little white church house, even from a downtown coffee house, just to name a few. It has advanced to reach people locally, regionally, and internationally of great diversity. Thus, in the 90's, Wellesley Park Assembly of God was renamed Celebration International Church.

Today, under the leadership of Pastor Brian Faria, we pursue the vision of a life worth celebrating for all. Yes all, regardless of people's history, circumstance, or status. This life begins by knowing the One who redeems us from death and crowns us with loving mercy. Therefore, we are enthusiastic about revealing Christ, about raising people to greater purpose, and about reaching others everywhere we go.

We invite you to see for yourself how exciting church can be when the focus is simple, and people are free to seek God with passion.

Celebration International Church Government

As you consider investing your heart, time, family, and finances into the life of a church, it is important for you to feel confident in church leadership. Our goal in sharing the details of Celebration International Church's government is that you can better understand that our church is structured to support the values of integrity, accountability, and spiritual authority.

1. Guided by ______.

The ministry teams and church staff is led by the Lead Pastor, Brian Faria. He oversees the day-to-day ministry and operations of the church. The pastor and his team serve the congregation and are responsible for the development of the spiritual life of the church.

2. Protected by ______.

Our Board is comprised of members from the congregation. They are appointed by the Lead Pastor and congregation, to oversee the finances, provide counsel to the Lead Pastor, and provide spiritual protection to the church. The Board serve as non- staff deacons.

3. Empowered by ______.

We are empowered by our members. These covenanted partners support the life of our church and share responsibility for our church. Members participate in critical decisions, help with selection of leaders, provide mutual accountability, financially support the ministry, protect the unity and more. Church Finances

At Celebration International Church, we believe that giving is a gift from God. The reason why we give is because God first gave to us. Giving is a responsive act of worship.

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. Matthew 6:21

No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money. Matthew 6:24

We might have expected Jesus to say, You can't serve God and the devil. But he says the number one contender for your heart – the thing that poses a threat to **devotion** to God – is MONEY! So God gave us the greatest weapon against devotion to our money – **generosity**! When we give, we combat greed!

We believe there are **five values for biblical giving** found in the New Testament. Giving should be:

1. Willing and Cheerful

You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully."

2 Corinthians 9:7 (NLT)

2. A Regular Pattern

On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income...

1 Corinthians 16:2

3. Proportionate To One's Ability

... each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income... 1 Corinthians 16:2

4. Generous

For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability... 2 Corinthians 8:3

5. Sacrificial

... Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on." Mark 12:43-44 (NIV)

What about tithing? The tithe, or "first fruits" of our labor/income belong to God. We find this principle all through God's Word. Tithing, giving God the first 10% of our income to the local church, is the primary, practical way we acknowledge that God is first (Proverbs 3:9–10).

Understand that tithing existed before the law, tithing was commanded under the law, and tithing is still good for us today. While it may not be explicitly commanded in the New Testament, what we do see is that people who were changed by Jesus always gave more than the law required. We would say that because of what Jesus has done, tithing becomes the bare minimum for us today.

The best question to ask when it comes to giving is, "Because of how much God has given me, how much do I get to give back to Him?" Giving is a gift. It is a privilege. We get to give, we don't have to give.

Many people love to give to God and want to feel confident in the organization through which they give. At Celebration International Church, we want people to understand they are giving to God through the church, not to the church. As we openly share the honesty, integrity, and spiritual values that guide the financial practices of Celebration International Church, we believe people can focus on what God is calling them to give and trust that He is leading our church to steward it well.

Statement of Faith

1. The Scripture Inspired

The Scriptures, both the Old and New Testaments, are verbally inspired of God and are the revelation of God to man, the infallible, authoritative rule of faith and conduct.

2 Timothy 3:15-17; 1 Thessalonians 2:13; 2 Peter 1:21

2. The One True God

The one true God has revealed himself as the eternally self-existent "I AM," the Creator of heaven and earth and the Redeemer of mankind. He has further revealed himself as embodying the principles of relationship and association as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

2 Timothy 3:15-17; 1 Thessalonians 2:13; 2 Peter 1:21

3. The Deity of the Lord Jesus Christ

The Lord Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God. The Scriptures declare His virgin birth, His sinless life, His miracles, His substitutionary work on the cross, His bodily resurrection from the dead, and His exaltation of the right hand of God.

Corinthians 15:4; Acts 1:9,11; 2:33; Philippians 2:9-11; Hebrews 1:3

4. The Fall of Man

Man was created good and upright; for God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness." However, man by voluntary transgression fell and thereby incurred not only physical death but also spiritual death, which is separation from God.

Genesis 1:26,27; 2:17; 3:6; Romans 5:12-19

5. The Salvation of Man

Man's only hope of redemption is through the shed blood of Jesus Christ the Son of God. Salvation is received through repentance toward God and faith toward the Lord Jesus Christ. By the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit, being justified by grace through faith, man becomes an heir of God according to the hope of eternal life. The inward evidence of salvation is the direct witness of the Spirit (Romans 8:16). The outward evidence to all men is a life of righteousness and true holiness.

6. The Salvation of Man

The ordinance of baptism by immersion is commanded in the Scriptures. All who repent and believe on Christ as Savior and Lord are to be baptized. Thus they declare to the world that they have died with Christ and that they also have been raised with Him to walk in newness of life. The ordinance of the Lord's Supper, consisting of the elements —bread and the fruit of the vine—is the symbol expressing our sharing the divine nature of our Lord Jesus Christ; a memorial of His suffering and death; and a prophecy of His second coming; and is enjoined on all believers "till He come!"

7. The Baptism in the Holy Spirit

All believers are entitled to and should ardently expect and earnestly seek the promise of the Father, the baptism in the Holy Spirit and fire, according to the command of our Lord Jesus Christ. This was the normal experience of all in the early Christian church. With it comes the enduement of power for life and service, the bestowment of the gifts and their uses in the work of the ministry. This experience is distinct from and subsequent to the experience of the new birth. With the baptism in the Holy Spirit come such experiences as an overflowing fullness of the Spirit, a deepened reverence for God, an intensified consecration to God and dedication to His work, and a more active love for Christ, for His Word, and for the lost.

8. The Initial Physical Evidence of the Baptism in the Holy Spirit

The baptism of believers in the Holy Spirit is witnessed by the initial physical sign of speaking with other tongues as the Spirit of God gives them utterance. The speaking in tongues in this instance is the same in essence as the gift of tongues, but different in purpose and use.

Acts 2:4; 1 Corinthians 12:4-10, 28

9. Sanctification

Sanctification is an act of separation from that which is evil, and of dedication unto God. Scriptures teach a life of "holiness without which no man shall see the Lord." By the power of the Holy Spirit we are able to obey the command: "Be ye holy, for I am holy." Sanctification is realized in the believer by recognizing his identification with Christ in His death and resurrection, and by faith reckoning daily upon the fact of that union, and by offering every faculty continually to the dominion of the Holy Spirit.

10. The Church and Its Mission

The Church is the body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Spirit, with divine appointments for the fulfillment of her Great Commission. Each believer, born of the Spirit, is an integral part of the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven.

Ephesians 1:22,23; 2:22; Hebrews 12:23

11. The Ministry

A divinely called and scripturally ordained ministry has been provided by our Lord for the fourfold purpose of leading the Church in: (1) evangelization of the world, (2) worship of God, (3) building a Body of saints being perfected in the image of His Son, and (4) meeting human need with ministries of love and compassion. Mark 16:15-20; John 4:23-24; Ephesians 4:11, 16; Psalms 112:9; Galatians 2:10; 6:10; James 1:27

12. Divine Healing

Divine healing is an integral part of the gospel. Deliverance from sickness is provided for in the Atonement, and is the privilege of all believers.

Isaiah 53:4,5; Matthew 8:16,17; James 5:14-16

13. The Blessed Hope

The resurrection of those who have fallen asleep in Christ and their translation together with those who are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord is the imminent and blessed hope of the Church. 1 Thessalonians 4:16,17; Romans 8:23; Titus 2:13; 1 Corinthians 15:51,52

14. The Millennial Reign of Christ

The second coming of Christ includes the rapture of the saints, which is our blessed hope, followed by the visible return of Christ with His saints to reign on the earth for one thousand years. This millennial reign will bring the salvation of national Israel and the establishment of universal peace.

15. The Final Judgment

There will be a final judgment in which the wicked dead will be raised and judged according to their works. Whosoever is not found written in the Book of Life, together with the devil and his angels, the beast and the false prophet, will be consigned to everlasting punishment in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death.

16. The New Heavens and the New Earth
